Class Size Reduction is the categorical program in the Governor's Proposed Budget for FY 2004-2005 which funds the operational costs associated with implementing the 2004-2005 constitutional amendment requirements to reduce the pupil/teacher ratio. Amendment IX of the Florida Constitution requires a maximum class size for grades pre-kindergarten through 3 to be 18 students, for grades 4 through 8 to be 22, and grades 9 through 12 to be 25. For fiscal years 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, the requirements for implementation of the Class Size Amendment were to reduce the class size on a district-level by 2.0 for each category or to meet the Class Size Amendment requirement for each category at the district level. The District met the district-level requirement in pre-kindergarten through 3rd grade and in grades 9 through 12. However, the District class size for grades 4 through 8 was 22.70 , and the District did not meet the district-level requirement.

For FY 2004-2005, the District will allocate funds to implement the class size constitutional requirement at the school-level class size for grades pre-kindergarten through 3 of 18 and the constitutional requirement at a district-level for grades grades 4 through 8 of $\mathbf{2 2}$ and grades 9 through 12 of 25 . All data used to calculate Class Size Allocation has been provided through MIS directly from each school's data.

For budgeting purposes, there is a section on the Salary Menu (MIS 3382) for your school for Class Size Reduction - Project 4125. Finance has already entered the number of units allocated to your school. By Constitutional mandate, schools may not cash in these positions or use the funds for any other purpose.

Class Size Reduction - Instructional Materials Allocation and Class Size Operational Allocation will be made after the District has determined the number of additional classrooms needed at each school. The District will make the allocation in sufficient time to order additional instructional materials and supplies for new teachers.

## Appendix C

## Maximum Class Size and Class Load

## Definitions:

Class Size is the number of students assigned to a teacher for a period of instruction. In elementary schools, where one teacher directs all learning, it is the number of pupils for whom a teacher is responsible daily. In secondary schools or other schools in which teachers are responsible for instruction in a particular subject, it is the number of pupils for whom a teacher is responsible during a single period.

Class Load is the number of pupils for whom teachers are responsible daily where the teacher is assigned more than one class each day.

If a class consists of two grades, whichever of the two grades' maximum class size is the smallest shall be the maximum class size for that class. In addition, the $10 \%$ beyond provision of Article VI shall not apply in the case of combination classes.
