Supplemental Academic Instruction Allocations FY 2004-05

On March 3, 2004, Terry Bevino, Wayne Ansley, Frank Fuller, Robert McEachern, Patricia Wascom, Mike Foxworthy, and Steve Horton met to make recommendations on the allocation of SAI categorical funds for the 2004-2005 school year. SAI funds will be allocated in thirds with #1 and #2 being funded in schools' original budgets and #3 funded after retention and FCAT graduation results are confirmed. FCAT results used are the most current available and are from the 2002-2003 school year.

1. A lump sum in the amount of \$62,000 will be allocated to each school.

2. The FCAT-related formula will be as follows:

- Fund the number of Level 1 and Level 2 students in reading or math or below 3 on writing for grades 3-8.
- For elementary schools, add an equivalent amount to the above to serve K-2 students in a preventative mode.
- Grade 9 will be funded for Level 1 students in reading and math; no Level 2 students will be funded as cut scores in 10th grade are in Level 2.
- Grade 10 will be funded for Level 1 reading and math to enable the school to intervene before the students take the FCAT in March 2005.
- There will be no Level 2 funding in high schools as the cut score for graduation is in Level 2; there will be no writing funded in high school because no writing remediation is provided as writing is not part of the FCAT graduation requirement.

3. The Plan of Care allocation will be made as follows:

- An additional portion of SAI funds will be allocated for retainees on a per student basis; in 2003-2004 this was known as Plan of Care.
- Students in grades 10, 11, and 12 who have taken the FCAT and not met the graduation cut score in reading and/or math will be funded.

Estimated Allocation Methodology

The estimated allocation for the first and second year retentions and for high school non-passing FCAT students is estimated to be as follows:

- **a.** Estimated allocation for first year retainees (current estimate is 1,000 students) will be \$2,000 per student.
- **b.** Estimated allocation for second year retainees (current estimate is 300 students) is \$2,000 per student.
- **c.** Estimated allocation for high school FCAT 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students not meeting graduation cut score in reading and/or math (current estimate is 300 students) will be \$500 per student.

The 2004-2005 allocation for Plan of Care may vary based on the actual results for the 2003-2004 school year and on changes in funding approved by the Legislature. Schools should not make any commitments for Plan of Care funds until they receive their allocation from Budgeting. The anticipated date for the Plan of Care allocation is after July 1, 2004.

Excerpt from The 2003 Florida Statutes

1011.62(1)(f) Supplemental academic instruction; categorical fund.--

- (f) Supplemental academic instruction; categorical fund.--
- 1. There is created a categorical fund to provide supplemental academic instruction to students in kindergarten through grade 12. This paragraph may be cited as the "Supplemental Academic Instruction Categorical Fund."
- 2. Categorical funds for supplemental academic instruction shall be allocated annually to each school district in the amount provided in the General Appropriations Act. These funds shall be in addition to the funds appropriated on the basis of FTE student membership in the Florida Education Finance Program and shall be included in the total potential funds of each district. These funds shall be used to provide supplemental academic instruction to students enrolled in the K-12 program. Supplemental instruction strategies may include, but are not limited to: modified curriculum, reading instruction, after-school instruction, tutoring, mentoring, class size reduction, extended school year, intensive skills development in summer school, and other methods for improving student achievement. Supplemental instruction may be provided to a student in any manner and at any time during or beyond the regular 180-day term identified by the school as being the most effective and efficient way to best help that student progress from grade to grade and to graduate.
- 3. Effective with the 1999-2000 fiscal year, funding on the basis of FTE membership beyond the 180-day regular term shall be provided in the FEFP only for students enrolled in juvenile justice education programs. Funding for instruction beyond the regular 180-day school year for all other K-12 students shall be provided through the supplemental academic instruction categorical fund and other state, federal, and local fund sources with ample flexibility for schools to provide supplemental instruction to assist students in progressing from grade to grade and graduating.
- 4. The Florida State University School, as a developmental research school, is authorized to expend from its FEFP or Lottery Enhancement Trust Fund allocation the cost to the student of remediation in reading, writing, or mathematics for any graduate who requires remediation at a postsecondary educational institution.
- 5. Beginning in the 1999-2000 school year, dropout prevention programs as defined in ss. $\underline{1003.52}$, $\underline{1003.53}$ (1)(a), (b), and (c), and $\underline{1003.54}$ shall be included in group 1 programs under subparagraph (d)3.
