### Supplemental Academic Instruction Allocations FY 2005-06

Using the basic formula for allocating SAI funds in 2004-05, on March 7, 2005, Linda Wright, Robert McEachern, Patricia Wascom, Rita Scallan, and Terry Bevino met to finalize the SAI 2005-06 allocation to schools. SAI funds will continue to be allocated in thirds with the first and second allocation being funded in the schools' original budget and the third allocation funded after retention and FCAT graduation-exam results are confirmed. The second allocation uses the current FCAT results from the 2003-04 school year. The SAI allocation formula is as follows:

### 1. Lump allocation to all schools of \$62,000

### 2. Funds for intervention and remediation <u>during the school day</u> will be allocated as follows:

- For elementary schools, fund for the number of Level 1 and 2 students in reading, math, and/or below 3.5 in writing for grades 3-5 (writing for grade 4)
- For elementary schools, add an equivalent amount to the above to serve K-2 in a prevention and remediation mode
- Grades 6-10 will be funded for Level 1, math only (reading intervention funded separately)
- Grades 6-8 will be funded for Level 2, math only (reading intervention funded separately)

## 3. Plan of Care will fund two <u>groups</u> of students with intervention to be provided outside the school day as follows:

- Retainees: K-2 who are retained by PPP criteria
   Grades 3-8 who are retained by FCAT and additional PPP criteria
- Failure to meet graduation requirements for grades 10, 11, &12; fund for Level 1 math and reading

SAI funds for remediation for retained students has been historically allocated to students who are retained because of poor FCAT performance (grades 3-8);students who are in grades 6-8 who are retained because of grades have not been funded. Students in high school are not retained because of poor FCAT performance; if they do not make the cut score for graduation, they are still able to move on and earn credits in the succeeding grade, but they are allocated funds for instruction outside the school day.

The 2005-2006 allocation for Plan of Care may vary based on the actual results for the 2004-2005 school year and on changes in funding approved by the Legislature. Schools should not make any commitments for Plan of Care funds until they receive their allocation from Budgeting. The anticipated date for the Plan of Care allocation is after July 1, 2005.

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### **Excerpt from The 2004 Florida Statutes**

### 1011.62(1)(f) Supplemental academic instruction; categorical fund.--

- 1. There is created a categorical fund to provide supplemental academic instruction to students in kindergarten through grade 12. This paragraph may be cited as the "Supplemental Academic Instruction Categorical Fund."
- 2. Categorical funds for supplemental academic instruction shall be allocated annually to each school district in the amount provided in the General Appropriations Act. These funds shall be in addition to the funds appropriated on the basis of FTE student membership in the Florida Education Finance Program and shall be included in the total potential funds of each district. These funds shall be used to provide supplemental academic instruction to students enrolled in the K-12 program. Supplemental instruction strategies may include, but are not limited to: modified curriculum, reading instruction, after-school instruction, tutoring, mentoring, class size reduction, extended school year, intensive skills development in summer school, and other methods for improving student achievement. Supplemental instruction may be provided to a student in any manner and at any time during or beyond the regular 180-day term identified by the school as being the most effective and efficient way to best help that student progress from grade to grade and to graduate.
- 3. Effective with the 1999-2000 fiscal year, funding on the basis of FTE membership beyond the 180-day regular term shall be provided in the FEFP only for students enrolled in juvenile justice education programs. Funding for instruction beyond the regular 180-day school year for all other K-12 students shall be provided through the supplemental academic instruction categorical fund and other state, federal, and local fund sources with ample flexibility for schools to provide supplemental instruction to assist students in progressing from grade to grade and graduating.
- 4. The Florida State University School, as a lab school, is authorized to expend from its FEFP or Lottery Enhancement Trust Fund allocation the cost to the student of remediation in reading, writing, or mathematics for any graduate who requires remediation at a postsecondary educational institution.
- 5. Beginning in the 1999-2000 school year, dropout prevention programs as defined in ss.  $\underline{1003.52}$ ,  $\underline{1003.53}$ (1)(a), (b), and (c), and  $\underline{1003.54}$  shall be included in group 1 programs under subparagraph (d)3.
