Advanced Placement is a direct allocation to secondary schools for Advanced Placement programs. This allocation is in addition to the base student funding for students in Advanced Placement which is included in each school's discretionary revenue allocation.

Project Number: 2154

Allocation Method: This revenue projection is based on students successfully completing the Advanced Placement examinations per the Final Conference Report. The Final Conference Report projected 262.56; therefore, the WFTE was prorated based on WFTE earned as a result of the 2006-2007 AP tests.

Allocation Amount: The District used the prorated WFTE, the Base Student Allocation and the District Cost Differential from the Final Conference Report for fiscal year 2008-2009. The school allocation is 90% of the revenue projection.

1011.62 Funds for operation of schools.—

Advanced Placement

- (n) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership based on college board advanced placement scores of students.--A value of 0.24 full-time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each student in each advanced placement course who receives a score of 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination for the prior year and added to the total full-time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 9 through 12 in the subsequent fiscal year. Each district must allocate at least 80 percent of the funds provided to the district for advanced placement instruction, in accordance with this paragraph, to the high school that generates the funds. The school district shall distribute to each classroom teacher who provided advanced placement instruction:
- 1. A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by the Advanced Placement teacher in each advanced placement course who receives a score of 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination.
- 2. An additional bonus of \$500 to each Advanced Placement teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who has at least one student scoring 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination, regardless of the number of classes taught or of the number of students scoring a 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination.

Bonuses awarded to a teacher according to this paragraph shall not exceed \$2,000 in any given school year and shall be in addition to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is scheduled to receive.
