Okaloosa County School District Supplemental Academic Instruction Allocations FY 2008-2009



The allocation methodology for SAI funding has been revised for fiscal year 2008-2009. SAI funds will be used for intervention and remediation during the school day. For the 2008-09 school year, SAI funds are being allocated to schools for specific personnel, programs and resources to be used to improve the academic achievement of the District's lowest performing students. Each funded item is based on identified criteria, appropriate to the school level and student group to be served.

Plan of Care will continue to be funded for three <u>groups</u> of students with remediation to be <u>provided outside the school day</u>. The three groups are as follows:

- Retainees: K-2 who are retained by PPP criteria
 Grades 3-8 who are retained by FCAT and/or additional PPP criteria
- 9th and 10th grade students who have failed to be promoted to the next grade level, as of the beginning of the school year, due to a failure to earn 1 full year core curriculum credit (English, Social Studies, Math, or Science)
- Failure to meet graduation requirements for grades 10, 11, &12; fund for Level 1 and Level 2 (non-passing) math and reading.

For the 2008-2009 school year, tutoring instructional services will be provided at a minimum teacher pupil ratio of 1 to 3 and at a maximum of 1 to 5. POC students will receive a minimum of two hours or a maximum of three hours of tutoring services per week. As in prior years qualifying students will be identified and funded. Funding information will be provided at a later date.

Staff providing tutoring services will complete an "Other Compensation Report Time Sheet" (form MIS 3475) which will be submitted to the School Payroll Designee. The school will complete an "Other Compensation Report" (MIS 3180) which will include an attached copy of the MIS 3475 form.

As in the past, transactions for students receiving tutoring services through Sylvan Learning Center will also be handled by the Quality Assurance Department.

# **Excerpt from The 2007 Florida Statutes**

# 1011.62(1)(f) Supplemental academic instruction; categorical fund.—

- 1. There is created a categorical fund to provide supplemental academic instruction to students in kindergarten through grade 12. This paragraph may be cited as the "Supplemental Academic Instruction Categorical Fund."
- 2. Categorical funds for supplemental academic instruction shall be allocated annually to each school district in the amount provided in the General Appropriations Act. These funds shall be in addition to the funds appropriated on the basis of FTE student membership in the Florida Education Finance Program and shall be included in the total potential funds of each district. These funds shall be used to provide supplemental academic instruction to students enrolled in the K-12 program. Supplemental instruction strategies may include, but are not limited to: modified curriculum, reading instruction, after-school instruction, tutoring, mentoring, class size reduction, extended school year, intensive skills development in summer school, and other methods for improving student achievement. Supplemental instruction may be provided to a student in any manner and at any time during or beyond the regular 180-day term identified by the school as being the most effective and efficient way to best help that student progress from grade to grade and to graduate.
- 3. Effective with the 1999-2000 fiscal year, funding on the basis of FTE membership beyond the 180-day regular term shall be provided in the FEFP only for students enrolled in juvenile justice education programs or in education programs for juveniles placed in secure facilities or programs under s. 985.19. Funding for instruction beyond the regular 180-day school year for all other K-12 students shall be provided through the supplemental academic instruction categorical fund and other state, federal, and local fund sources with ample flexibility for schools to provide supplemental instruction to assist students in progressing from grade to grade and graduating.
- 4. The Florida State University School, as a lab school, is authorized to expend from its FEFP or Lottery Enhancement Trust Fund allocation the cost to the student of remediation in reading, writing, or mathematics for any graduate who requires remediation at a postsecondary educational institution.
- 5. Beginning in the 1999-2000 school year, dropout prevention programs as defined in ss.  $\underline{1003.52}$ ,  $\underline{1003.53}(1)(a)$ , (b), and (c), and  $\underline{1003.54}$  shall be included in group 1 programs under subparagraph (d)3.
