Okaloosa County School District Proposed Millage



Required Local Effort Millage

- 3.331* mills for 2022-2023 compared to 3.695 mills in 2021-2022, a decrease of 0.364 mills
- Set by the State and required in order to receive the State allocation of funds (FEFP)

Discretionary Operating Millage

• 0.748 mills for 2022-2023 compared to 0.748 mills in 2021-2022, no change in millage (all districts levy this amount)

Capital Outlay and Maintenance

• 1.5 mills for 2022-2023 compared to 1.5 mills in 2021-2022, no change in millage.

TOTAL MILLAGE

• 5.579 mills for 2022-2023 compared to 5.943 mills in 2021-2022, a decrease of 0.364 mills.

What is a mill?

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A mill is a tax levy applied to the assessed value of a property.

1.0 mill equals \$1.00 tax for each \$1,000 of assessed property value. 2.0 mills equals \$2.00 tax for each \$1,000 of assessed property value, etc.

Although the School District's proposed millage is 0.364 lower than last year, the revenue collected from property taxes is expected to increase due to increased property values. This anticipated increase requires us to advertise a Notice of Proposed Tax Increase.

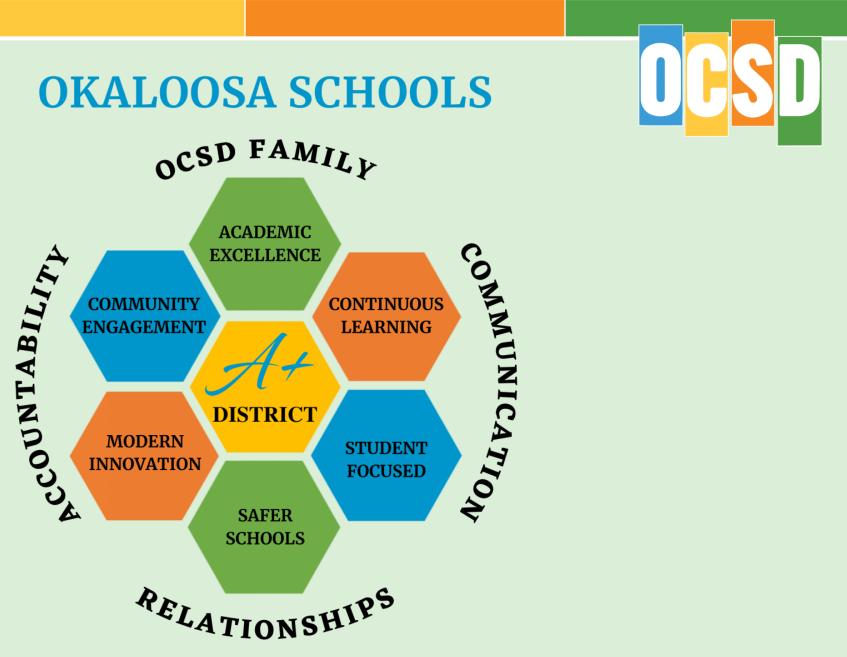
