Class Size Reduction is the categorical program in the proposed budget for fiscal year 2025-2026 which funds the costs associated with implementing the constitutional amendment requirements to reduce the pupil/teacher ratio. Amendment IX of the Florida Constitution requires a maximum class size for grades pre-kindergarten through 3 to be 18 students, for grades 4 through 8 to be 22 students, and for grades 9 through 12 to be 25 students.

For fiscal year 2025-2026, the Class Size Reduction teaching unit allocation methodology is illustrated below. Elementary teaching units are rounded up to the nearest whole. All other teaching units are rounded up to the nearest 0.20.
