Revised Allocation - Second Chance Project #3113

As previously mentioned, in Technical Assistance Memorandum (TAM 2003-003) dated August 27, 2002, retained student data would be revised mid-September to allow for adjustments for increases or decreases in student enrollment at each school. The verification of retained students for Fiscal Year 2002-2003 has been revised and finalized. As a result, any school which had an increase or decrease in the number of retained students will receive an increase or decrease in their "Second Chance" project allocation. The allocation methodology remains at \$2,000 per retained student. Each school's budget will reflect the adjustment on Monday, September 30, 2002.

Attached you will find a spreadsheet entitled "Revised Second Chance Funds Allocation" which lists each school that had retentions in grades K – 8, the number of retentions by category and the revised total allocation per school. The revised data is based on the most current retention data available which is September 12, 2002. The last column on the spreadsheet reflects the budget adjustment which the Finance Department will make to each school's budget based on whether there was an increase or decrease in the total number of retained students at that school site.

In the future, if your school receives a retained student from out-of- state or out-of-county, please fax a memorandum to the Finance Department, at 833-7699, with the student's name, number, and grade level. The information will be verified through the TERMS student record system with the MIS Department. Once the data has been verified Finance will process a budget amendment to increase your school's allocation and will notify your school when the adjustment has been completed.

Remember, each school must submit an approved budget before funds will be released.
