Additional Staff and Instructional Materials Allocation

The Finance Department has received the 2007 FCAT data from Information Systems. The initial allocation for the 2007-2008 Secondary Reading Initiative Program was based on 2006 FCAT data. The Secondary Reading Initiative section of the Budget Manual notified schools that when the District received the 2007 FCAT data, Finance would recalculate the staff and materials allocation for each school and send out a revised allocation.

Attached you will find two Class Size Reduction - Secondary Reading Initiative spreadsheets:

- 1) The Estimated Teaching Unit Allocation spreadsheet lists each school's original student data, original estimated teaching units, original estimated teaching unit allocation, revised student data, revised estimated teaching units, revised estimated teaching units rounded to the nearest .20 of a unit, increase in estimated teaching units, the increase in teaching unit allocations, and the revised total allocation. Schools will not be negatively impacted if they experienced a decrease in student numbers. If your school had an increase, a Change of Funding may be entered via OASIS.
- 2) The Estimated Classroom and Assessment Materials Allocation reflects the school's original allocation, revised student data, increase in number of students, additional allocation for classroom and assessment materials, and revised total allocation. Schools will not be negatively impacted if they experienced a decrease in student numbers. The increase in instructional materials has been budgeted in 1010-5100-0510-your school-6120.
