SUBJECT:

1% State Revenue Potential Reduction

Schools were notified on July 11, 2007, of the dollar value of a 1% reduction for each school and district program based on selected state categorical projects and the discretionary project. Each school was asked to review their respective budget and submit their proposed 1% potential budget reduction plan, by object code, to Finance.

Please refer to the attached spreadsheet entitled "1% State Revenue Potential Reduction," which reflects each school's proposed budget reduction plan summarized by object code. The indicated amounts will be deducted from the corresponding object codes and placed in the following budget line item: 1010-5100-0234-Your Cost Center-Project (if applicable). Object code 0234 will serve as a temporary holding account for each school's potential budget reduction amount until the final amount is determined based on the results of the Special Legislative Session. Using object code 0234 will provide the district and school with a quick and easy way to identify the amount of funds earmarked for potential budget reductions.

If a school does not have sufficient funds in the object code submitted to Finance, our office will contact you regarding the object code and amount deducted to cover your overall potential reduction plan.
