Summer Intensive Studies (SIS) - Project 9127

Initial Allocation - Terms 1 and 2

Summer Intensive Studies (SIS) will be held at the high schools for Term 1 and all schools for Term 2. The Budgeting & Financial Services Department has allocated funds for the SIS program - Term 1 and Term 2. The attached spreadsheet reflects each participating school's allocation.

Pertinent information regarding SIS and your school's budget is noted below:

I. High Schools

A. There will be two terms of SIS:

- 1. SIS Term 1 will be held June 9 through June 26, 2009, with a make-up day on Monday, June 29, 2009. The term will consist of 14 days plus one makeup day and will be operated Monday through Friday.
- 2. SIS Term 2 will be held July 6 through July 28, 2009, with a make-up day on Wednesday, July 29, 2009. The term will consist of 14 days plus one makeup day and will be operated Monday through Thursday.
- B. Per Quality Assurance, SIS will be for the purpose of Credit Recovery. Please see the attached spreadsheet for the summer school locations.
- C. Each school's initial allocation was based on school projections provided by Quality Assurance. Schools will not be "held harmless" as enrollment will be verified on each Term's FTE "date certain," and funds will be adjusted accordingly.
- D. The Teacher to Student Ratio will be 1:21, and sections will be closed when the average daily attendance for a teacher drops below 18.0.
- E. Teachers working the entire 15 days of a term will be paid 82.50 hours (5.00 hours of instruction + 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day X 15 days = 82.50 hours). (Note: Teachers will earn an additional 5% leave; therefore, the budget allocation includes funds for 86.63 hours.)
- F. The allocations have been budgeted in salaries for hourly teachers (1010-5100-0132-Center-9127) and supplies (1010-5100-0510-Center-9127). Each school may begin making budget amendments to allocate supply dollars to the specific expenditure objects required to implement its summer program.
- G. Transportation and food service will not be provided.

II. Middle Schools

- A. Middle schools will hold SIS during Term 2, July 6 through July 30, 2009. The term will consist of 16 days and will be operated Monday through Thursday.
- B. Per Quality Assurance, SIS will be for the purpose of Course Recovery, Remediation in Language Arts (Reading) and Math. Please see the attached spreadsheet for the summer school locations.
- C. Each school's initial allocation will be based on school projections provided by Quality Assurance. Schools will not be "held harmless" as enrollment will be verified on the Term's FTE "date certain," and funds will be adjusted accordingly.
- D. The Teacher to Student Ratio will be 1:18, and sections will be closed when the average daily attendance for a teacher drops below 15.0.
- E. Teachers working the entire 16 days will be paid 80.00 hours (4.50 hours of instruction + 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day X 16 days = 80.00 hours). (Note: Teachers will earn an additional 5% leave; therefore, the budget allocation includes funds for 84.00 hours.)
- F. Transportation will be provided for Middle Schools with limited stops. These schools will not be responsible for SIS transportation costs. As transportation costs are accumulated and charged to the schools' SIS budgets, the SIS budgets will be increased accordingly. Food service will not be provided.

III. Elementary Schools

- A. Elementary schools will hold SIS during Term 2, July 6 through July 30, 2009. The term will consist of 16 days and will be operated Monday through Thursday.
- B. Per Quality Assurance, SIS will be for the purpose of Remediation in Language Arts (Reading) and Math. Please see the attached spreadsheet for the summer school locations.
- C. Each school's initial allocation will be based on school projections provided by Quality Assurance. Schools will not be "held harmless" as enrollment will be verified on the Term's FTE "date certain," and funds will be adjusted accordingly.
- D. The Teacher to Student Ratio will be 1:15, and sections will be closed when the average daily attendance for a teacher drops below 12.0.
- E. Teachers working the entire 16 days will be paid 80.00 hours (4.50 hours of instruction + 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day X 16 days = 80.00 hours). (Note: Teachers will earn an additional 5% leave; therefore, the budget allocation includes funds for 84.00 hours.)
- F. Transportation will be provided for Elementary Schools with limited stops. These schools will not be responsible for SIS transportation costs. As transportation costs are accumulated and charged to the schools' SIS budgets, the SIS budgets will be increased accordingly. Food service will not be provided.

- 2. Teacher to Student Ratio: Elementary 1:15, Middle 1:18, High 1:21
- 3. Sections will be closed when the average daily attendance for a teacher drops below 12.0 (Elementary), 15.0 (Middle), or 18.0 (High).
- 4. High School teachers working the entire 15 days will be paid 82.50 hours (5.00 hours instruction plus 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day times 15 days).
- 5. Middle and Elementary School teachers working the entire 16 days will be paid 80.00 hours (4.50 hours instruction plus 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day times 16 days).
- 6. Supply allocation is \$50 per teacher for High Schools (Term 1 only) and Middle/Elementary Schools (Term 2 only).
- 7. Schools will not be "held harmless." Enrollment will be verified on each Term's FTE "date certain" and funds will be adjusted.
