SUBJECT:

Summer Intensive Studies (SIS) - Project 3127

Initial Allocation - Sessions 1 and 2 - All Schools

Summer Intensive Studies (SIS) will be held at all schools for Session 1 and at elementary and high schools for Session 2. In addition, Session 2 may be utilized by middle schools for program completion upon approval of the Assistant Superintendent - Curriculum. If needed, the number of allowable, additional days will be determined by the Assistant Superintendent - Curriculum and will follow Session 2 as scheduled for high school SIS.

The Budgeting & Financial Services Department has made the initial allocation for the SIS program based on actual 2012 SIS attendance; however, the allocation will be adjusted based on actual attendance. The attached spreadsheet reflects each participating school's allocation. Pertinent information regarding SIS and your school's budget is noted below.

I. High Schools

- A. The purpose of High School SIS will be:
 - 1. Credit recovery via Ed 20/20 for students lacking credits and who are in danger of not being promoted or graduating.
 - 2. Remediation of students lacking the necessary skills in Algebra 1 and Geometry through face to face instruction.
- B. There will be two sessions of SIS:
 - 1. SIS Session 1 will be held June11, 2013, through June 28, 2013. The term will consist of 14 days and will be operated Monday through Thursday (week 1) and Monday through Friday (weeks 2 and 3).
 - SIS Session 2 will be held July 9, 2013, through July 26, 2013. The term will consist of 14 days and will be operated Tuesday through Friday (week 1) and Monday through Friday (weeks 2 and 3).
- C. Pre-planning for Session 1 will be three (3) hours on June 10, 2013. Pre-planning for Session 2 will be three (3) hours on July 8, 2013.

- D. SIS will be held at the following locations. Students attending the CHOICE High School & Technical Center will attend SIS at their zoned high school.
 - 1. Baker School,
 - 2. Choctaw High School,
 - 3. Crestview High School,
 - 4. Fort Walton Beach High School,
 - 5. Laurel Hill School, and
 - 6. Niceville High School.
- E. Students will attend SIS from 7:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. (5.50 hours), and the teacher duty day will be from 7:15 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. (6.00 hours).
- F. Students will be allowed to take an Ed 20/20 pre-test and will only have to complete the sections that they do not receive a 70% on.
- G. No student may attend less than the full day, full session (14 days) identified in the SIS schedule unless he/she has met drop-out prevention criteria. In such case, the appropriate form (MIS 4198) must be completed with required signatures.
- H. Student/Teacher Ratios:
 - 1. Course Recovery: 1 teacher to the number of seats available in the computer lab (minimum 15 students). Please note that a lab must be completely filled prior to opening an additional lab. Student attendance will be monitored during each SIS session.
 - 2. Face to Face Instruction: 1 teacher to 21 student ratio (minimum 15 students). Student attendance will be monitored during each SIS session.
- I. With the exception of performance-based programs, all SIS teachers (face to face instruction) must be certified in the subject taught.
- J. Transportation will not be provided.
- K. A lunch period is included in the schedule. Each school will determine its own lunch schedule.
- L. The initial allocation is based on the actual 2012 SIS attendance. Information Systems will be capturing attendance data during the week of June 17 June 21, 2013, (Session 1) and July 8 July 12, 2013 (Session 2). Please staff your schools according to your student needs. Budgeting will adjust each school's allocation up or down based on actual attendance.
- M. Teachers working the entire 14 days of a session will be paid 87.00 hours (5.00 of instruction + 0.50 hour lunch duty + 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day X 14 days = 84.00 hours plus 3.00 hours pre-planning). (Note: Teachers will earn an additional 5% leave (4.50 hours); therefore, the budget allocation includes funds for 91.50 hours.)
- N. Schools have been allocated \$50 per teacher for supplies to be used for SIS.
- O. The allocations have been budgeted in salaries for hourly teachers (1010-5100-0132-Center-3127) and supplies (1010-5100-0510-Center-3127). Each school may begin making budget amendments to allocate supply dollars to the specific expenditure objects required to implement its summer program.

II. Middle Schools

- A. The purpose of Middle School SIS will be:
 - 1. Course recovery via Ed 20/20 for 6th through 8th grade students due to F's in core classes.
 - 2. Remediation in Reading and/or Math for 6th through 8th grade students retained due to the assessment series (level 1 in <u>all four assessments</u> FCAT/DEA).

- B. Middle schools will hold SIS during Session 1, June 11, 2013, through June 28, 2013. The term will consist of 14 days and will be operated Monday through Thursday (week 1) and Monday through Friday (weeks 2 and 3). Session 2 may be utilized for program completion upon approval of the Assistant Superintendent Curriculum. If needed, the number of allowable, additional days will be determined by the Assistant Superintendent Curriculum and will follow Session 2 as scheduled for high school SIS.
- C. Pre-planning for Session 1 will be three (3) hours on June 10, 2013.
- D. SIS will be held at the following locations. Students attending Okaloosa STEMM Academy will attend SIS at their zoned school.
 - 1. Baker School,
 - 2. Meigs Middle School,
 - 3. Shoal River Middle School,
 - 4. Laurel Hill School,
 - 5. Pryor Middle School,
 - 6. Bruner Middle School,
 - 7. Lewis K-8 School (for Lewis K-8 and Ruckel Middle School),
 - 8. Davidson Middle School, and
 - Destin Middle School.
- E. Students will attend SIS from 7:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. (5.50 hours), and the teacher duty day will be from 7:15 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. (6.00 hours).
- F. Students will be allowed to take an Ed 20/20 pre-test and will only have to complete the sections that they do not receive a 70% on.
- G. Priority should be given for upper classmen needing courses for promotion and also the number of courses needed to recovery.
- H. Student/Teacher Ratio:
 - 1. Course Recovery: 1 teacher to the number of seats available in the computer lab (minimum 15 students). Please note that a lab must be completely filled prior to opening an additional lab. Student attendance will be monitored during each SIS session.
- I. Transportation will be provided with limited stops. Area pick-ups are to be determined. There must be a minimum of 15 students on a bus for transportation. Schools will not be responsible for SIS transportation costs. As transportation costs are accumulated and charged to the schools' SIS budgets, the SIS budgets will be increased accordingly.
- J. A lunch period is included in the schedule. Each school will determine its own lunch schedule.
- K. The initial allocation is based on the actual 2012 SIS attendance. Information Systems will be capturing attendance data during the week of June 17 June 21, 2013. Please staff your schools according to your student needs. Budgeting will adjust each school's allocation up or down based on actual attendance.
- L. Teachers working the entire 14 days of a session will be paid 87.00 hours (5.00 of instruction + 0.50 hour lunch duty + 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day X 14 days = 84.00 hours plus 3.00 hours pre-planning). (Note: Teachers will earn an additional 5% leave (4.50 hours); therefore, the budget allocation includes funds for 91.50 hours.)
- M. Schools have been allocated \$50 per teacher for supplies to be used for SIS.
- N. The allocations have been budgeted in salaries for hourly teachers (1010-5100-0132-Center-3127) and supplies (1010-5100-0510-Center-3127). Each school may begin making budget amendments to allocate supply dollars to the specific expenditure objects required to implement its summer program.

III. <u>Elementary Schools</u>

- A. The purpose of Elementary School SIS will be for remediation in Reading and/or Math for the lowest performing students as defined below:
 - 1. Students in 3rd, 4th, or 5th Grade scoring an FCAT Level 1 in Reading and/or Math,
 - 2. Students in 1st or 2nd Grade scoring an "F" in Reading and/or Math,
 - 3. Students in Kindergarten scoring a "U" in Reading.
 - 4. Students retained or promoted on a Good Cause exemption/Administrative Promotion.
- B. Elementary schools will hold SIS during Sessions 1 and 2 as follows:
 - 1. SIS Session 1 will be held from June 17, 2013, through June 27, 2013. The term will consist of 8 days and will be operated Monday through Thursday.
 - 2. SIS Session 2 will be held from July 8, 2013, through July 25, 2013. The term will consist of 12 days and will be operated Monday through Thursday.
- C. Pre-planning will be three (3) hours on June 14, 2013.
- D. SIS will be held at the following locations:
 - 1. Plew Elementary School (for Plew, Bluewater, and Edge Elementary Schools and Lewis K-8 School Grades K through 5),
 - 2. Walker Elementary School (for Walker and Bob Sikes Elementary Schools),
 - 3. Riverside Elementary School (for Riverside, Antioch, and Northwood Elementary Schools),
 - 4. Mary Esther Elementary School (for Mary Esther and Florosa Elementary Schools),
 - 5. Wright Elementary School (for Wright and Kenwood Elementary Schools),
 - 6. Elliott Point Elementary School (for Elliott Point and Edwins Elementary Schools and NWFL Ballet Academie),
 - 7. Longwood Elementary School (for Longwood, Shalimar, and Eglin Elementary Schools),
 - 8. Destin Elementary School,
 - 9. Laurel Hill School, and
 - 10. Baker School.
- E. \$IS times will be as shown below:
 - 1. Students, with the exception of Baker and Laurel Hill, will attend SIS from 7:45 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. (5.00 hours + 0.50 hour for lunch), and the teacher duty day will be from 7:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. (6.00 hours).
 - 2. Students at Baker will attend SIS from 7:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. (5.00 hours + 0.50 hour for lunch), and the teacher duty day will be 7:15 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. (6.00 hours).
 - 3. Students at Laurel Hill will attend SIS from 8:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. (5.00 hours + 0.50 hour for lunch), and the teacher duty day will be from 7:45 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. (6.00 hours).
- F. The student/teacher ratio will be 12 to 1, and classes will be closed when the average daily attendance for a teacher drops below 9. Student attendance will be monitored during each SIS session.

- G. Transportation will be provided for all schools with limited stops. Area pick-ups are to be announced. There must be a minimum of 15 students on a bus. Schools will not be responsible for SIS transportation costs. As transportation costs are accumulated and charged to the schools' SIS budgets, the SIS budgets will be increased accordingly.
- H. A lunch period is included in the schedule. Each school will determine its own lunch schedule.
- I. Students must be remediated in the area(s) of need based upon the PPP retention criteria. For example, a student who is attending summer school due to scoring a level 1 on FCAT 2. Mathematics and earning a grade of an F in Mathematics for the year must be remediated in the area of Mathematics.
- J. The SESAT/SAT 10 will be administered at the conclusion of the SIS session for retained students only.
- K. The initial allocation is based on the actual 2012 SIS attendance. I nformation Systems will be capturing attendance data during the week of June 17 June 21, 2013, (Session 1) and July 8 July 12, 2013 (Session 2). Please staff your schools according to your student needs. Budgeting will adjust each school's allocation up or down based on actual attendance.

L. Hours to Be Paid:

- 1. Session 1 Teachers working the entire 8 days of Session 1 will be paid 51.00 hours (5.00 of instruction + 0.50 hour lunch duty + 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day X 8 days = 48.00 hours plus 3.00 hours pre-planning). (Note: Teachers will earn an additional 5% leave (2.75 hours); therefore, the budget allocation includes funds for 53.75 hours.)
- 2. Session 2 Teachers working the entire 12 days of Session 2 will be paid 72.00 hours (5.00 of instruction + 0.50 hour lunch duty + 0.50 hour for pre/post planning and program evaluation per day X 12 days = 72.00 hours). (Note: Teachers will earn an additional 5% leave (3.75 hours); therefore, the budget allocation includes funds for 75.75 hours.)
- M. Schools have been allocated \$50 per teacher for supplies to be used for SIS.
- N. The allocations have been budgeted in salaries for hourly teachers (1010-5100-0132-Center-3127) and supplies (1010-5100-0510-Center-3127). Each school may begin making budget amendments to allocate supply dollars to the specific expenditure objects required to implement its summer program.
